Subject: Designation request for West Path Delivery 2022 and 2023 projects - Request for comments

Dear Margot Trembath,

On February 26, 2020, the Minister of Environment and Climate Change (the Minister) received a request to designate four projects under the Impact Assessment Act. The Agency understands that Foothills Pipe Lines (South B.C) Ltd. (Foothills) and NOVA Gas Transmission Ltd. (NGTL) are proposing the construction and operation of several pipeline segments and associated facilities between southwest Alberta and southeast British Columbia, as part of a broader West Path Delivery Program, which is made up of four distinct projects (the West Path Delivery 2022 and 2023 Projects).

The purpose of this email is to inform you of the designation request and to seek your input regarding provincial regulatory processes in relation to the projects, and any associated assessment of effects and public and Indigenous consultation.

Designation Request

Under subsection 9(1) of *Impact Assessment Act* (IAA) the Minister may by order, designate a physical activity that is not prescribed in the *Physical Activities Regulations*. The Minister may do this, if, in the Minister's opinion, the physical activity may cause adverse effects within federal jurisdiction or adverse direct or incidental effects (resulting from federal decisions, including funding), or public concerns related to those effects warrant the designation. In accordance with subsection 9(4) of IAA, it is expected that the Minister will respond, with reasons, to the request by May 27, 2020.

The Projects

The projects would include approximately 120 kilometres of natural gas pipeline, and associated infrastructure, such as meter stations and would allow for the transportation of natural gas from sources in Alberta and British Columbia to southwest Alberta and downstream markets. Foothills and NGTL are wholly owned subsidiaries of TransCanada PipeLines Limited, which is an affiliate of TC Energy Corporation.
